His words delivered those who had been held captive by the darkness of this world: the blind suddenly could see, the lame could walk, the lepers were cleansed, and even those bound by the spirit of darkness were liberated. The words from His mouth were like the dawning sun of a brand new day; the light had come and the world could never be the same.

"To give light to them that sit in darkness" Luke 1:79

This describes daily life at Mary's Song. Without the girls even realizing it, the light of Christ would hit them when they walked through the doors, and darkness and hopelessness would leave. The testimonies have been unreal, miraculous, and hard to put into words. There is not a day that goes by that we don't witness something breaking off of these girls. From when they read their Bibles and find answers, or hear a word from the sermon at church that brings healing, we have the privilege of watching their lives grow from a stump into a beautiful tree that's planted by the rivers of God.

They will all graduate soon, and have the privilege of moving into our apartments. We then help them with jobs and continue to mentor them into their

next phase of life. There is nothing like community!

Spurgeon describes our frame of mind without Christ. "The gloom is thick and dense; not sun, nor moon, nor star appeareth, and there can be no light to illumine the understanding, the affections, the conscience. Man has no power to get light. He may strike the damp match of reason, but it will not yield him a clear flame. Rise, morning star! Come, Jesus, come! Thou art the sun of righteousness, and healing is beneath thy wings. Without Christ there is no light of true spiritual knowledge, no light of true spiritual enjoyment, no light in which the brightness of truth can be seen, or the warmth of fellowship proved."

I love this scripture! It contains the very words that God spoke to my heart to bring me from darkness and shame and into His marvelous light! On Wednesday December 7, 2011, I was dropped off at Victory Church after spending 30 days in jail for drug charges. I had heard about Mary's Song from a lady doing prison ministry in the jail where I was incarcerated and she arranged for me to be picked up and dropped off the evening of my release. It was the first time I had stepped into a church building for something other than a funeral or wedding in over 20 years! As the service started, I remember sitting in the pew feeling a whirlwind of emotions. Honestly, I was overwhelmingly thankful to be out of jail, but I was also completely out of my element. I had spent the greater part of 25 years in addiction and bondage to my sinful desires.

Now here I was, sitting in the pews of Victory Church on a wildly wonderful Holy Ghost Wednesday night! As worship began, I watched in awe and wonderment as a vibrant elderly woman twirled like a child in abandoned praise and worship at the altar. Somehow, I was caught up in her dance and thought to myself, "I have no idea what that is but I want it! I want to be free like that!" Then, I saw the Mary's Song girls dancing and clapping and praising God. Obviously, they too had been addicts like me, why else would they be in Mary's Song, but there they were, rejoicing and dancing and having fun! And in church!!! What was going on?! I was so confused but intrigued! And the strangest thing of all, as I sat and watched and tried to take everything in, I somehow felt deep inside at the core of my being, "I am home."

Four days later, Sunday morning service came, and I walked up and gave my heart to the Lord. But later that week, the doubting and condemning thoughts began to come. My past began to collide with the present and all the shameful things I had done began to cloud my heart and mind. I began to question how a person like me could ever truly be a Christian. I felt as if I was too dark to truly be saved and forgiven. And then it happened! As I read Psalm 34:4-5, "I sought the Lord and He heard me and delivered me from all my fears. Those who look to Him are radiant; their faces are never covered with shame." As soon as those words pierced my heart, my eyes were opened and I saw God, the Creator of the universe and my Father, look down at me from heaven and put His loving hand under my chin and lift my downcast face up to gaze into His loving and forgiving and powerful eyes and He said, "I love you.

I was there the whole time. I saw everything you did and I forgive you. Look at me and let your face shine with my love." And I crumbled. My heart broke in two with love and I began to weep. For the first time in my life, I felt loved, forgiven, and accepted! Not long after I was baptized in His Holy Spirit and I began to laugh! It has been almost 14 years since that day and I haven't stopped!

What joy there is in knowing that God chose a girl like me to be His daughter and loved me back to life! This is Who He is and this is what He does! This is redemption! This is Mary's Song! Thank you for faithfully standing with us for 17 amazing years and being part of the Lord's great and glorious work of loving His daughters back to life!

To some, it may seem as though my life is littered with failures. To Jesus and I, my life has been filled with discipleship. The word tells us "though the righteous man falls seven times, he rises again, but the wicked stumble when one disaster comes." -Proverbs 24:16. I am no longer the donkey written about in Psalm 32:9, that needs a bit and bridle to go the right way. God has given me a fresh start at Mary's Song. After being at Mary's Song for less than a month, I received a grief healing that had debilitated me my whole life. The undeniable power of God was felt throughout my entire being, and I received a peace that surpasses all understanding. I am an overcomer of the broken heart that held me in bondage to addiction.



Before I had a relationship with Jesus, I could not fathom living a sober-minded life without my children. I attempted secular recovery with no avail due to the lack of power in the name of Jesus. Being in an environment that drowns out the noises of the world, I was able to hear the still, small voice of the Holy Spirit. The washing of the word began to untie false beliefs. The spirit of suicide no longer oppresses m,e for the living word of the Almighty God has demolished its stronghold over me. My God-sized hole has been filled with joy unspeakable. Now, I stand on scripture like Jeremiah 29:11, "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future."



"But now, thus says ADONAI-- the One who created you, O Jacob, the One who formed you, O Israel: 'Fear not, for I have redeemed you, I have called you by name, you are Mine.'" -Isaiah 43:1 (TLV)

I am accepted by the beloved. I am healed and whole in Christ Jesus, and I am redeemed. I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who lives, but Christ who lives in me. I have been chosen, set apart, and saved by grace. importantly, I am forgiven, and she who is forgiven much, loves much. Now I look forward to fulfilling the purpose He has called me for. Thank you, Jesus. I'm thankful that my God is the God of restoration and that His word never returns void. I'm so blessed to be rooted in the community of Mary's Song Restoration Center for Women under the amazing leadership to help steward and shepherd my spiritual growth as a disciple of Christ. And endurance produces character: As I struggled in school to focus, etc. I also became an overachiever in many areas of my life. I studied hard, worked hard and became a people pleaser. I thought I had conquered how to deal with a profound hearing loss until suddenly I had emergency brain surgery.



I had a stroke which then led me to lose all communication skills. I had to relearn how to talk, write, text and work on memory skills, etc.

Character produces hope: God and His angels were with me that day-February 7th, 2025. He told me to call the ambulance as I cried out to help from Him. He reassured me that He was with me!


On arrival to the ER, I was rushed to emergency brain surgery. The Neurosurgeon said that if I had gone back to sleep that day, I would have died in my sleep.



God has helped me in the areas I struggled in and helped me to find a community to live in while I am healing and growing up. I can engage and communicate again, memorize scripture, pray, speak scripture, etc. While the enemy tried to use my hearing and communication skills against me, God has been faithful in restoring my ability to speak, hear, pray, sing, all for His glory! All because of God's love, which has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. Thank you staff at Mary's Song for all you do.
